(Danielle) Oak Ridge Family Support Services flyer which explains an 8-week curriculum for family members with current addiction or in early recovery. Covers disease model of addiction, codependency, and others. 1st meeting was last Monday and had 5 attendees. Program is free and every Monday from 6:30PM-7:30PM. MADC members welcome to tour facility and program. (Hailey) Stacey has been trying to contact Police Activities League (PAL) Directors. Having some difficulties getting in contact with them. (Hailey) The Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) is moving to classify synthetic kratom, known as 7-hydroxymitragynine (7-OH), as a Schedule I drug. This opioid is being sold right now — in shots, tablets, gummies, and drinks — at gas stations, smoke shops, and online, often in candy-like packaging. The DEA is not proposing the scheduling of mitragynine, the most

If you would like to submit a public comment regarding this, the deadline to do so is July 31st. (Kati) Pool Party that highlighted the Cessational Summer Challenge. 50 kids participated alongside Boise Parks and Rec. Cessational Summer Challenge currently on week 5 out of 8 Naloxone (Narcan) Distribution, Courtney Boyce is Central District Health's Opioid Strategist. Narcan distribution boxes are available in various locations and are accessible to anyone. Naloxone helps reverse opioid overdose. (Hailey) Jake is working on a research paper on peptides since that has been brought up at a few MADC meetings. It will be used for flyers and newsletter content. Information will be shared as soon as it is received. (Hailey) Yoonwa sent the West Ada School District (WASD) violation data. He shared violations seem to be leveling out. There was a drop when WASD first implemented vaping prevention program, CATCH My Breath (CMB). But now the data seems to be consistent. Middle school data is 111 tobacco violations, 39 drug and alcohol violations. High School data is 169 tobacco violations, 97 drug and alcohol violations. There were 4 elementary school violations but they were not specific to drugs, alcohol, or tobacco. This data is important for when we create Parent Prevention Packet booklets. (Kati C.) Started implementing CMB to 5th graders and getting more involved with Elementary schools. There is also a Substance Misuse Curriculum with CATCH. (David) Why is CMB not extended to 4th graders as they share recess/lunch with 5th graders? (Kati C.) Explained that CMB is evidence-based to begin at 5th grade. However, if classroom is mature enough to absorb content, then can proceed. (Danielle) Caffeine/nicotine pouches coming up and are trending. (Hailey) We've had school staff share with us that students are taking a caffeine pouch container and throwing away the caffeine pouches and replacing them with nicotine pouches. (Audrey) Younger population exposed to substances through experience at The Bridge. (Hailey) Jordan has been busy working on some critical incidents that have happened the last couple weeks, but she is working with officers to see what some current drug trends are in Meridian. (Hailey) Robert was a co-facilitator at MPD Youth Academy. This is a yearly program put on by Crime Prevention for teens aged 14-18 to learn about the police department and different departments within MPD. There's also a tour of the Ada County Dispatch Center and Coroner's Office. (Lindsay) Business Development Specialist with Northpoint Recovery and is excited to work with MADC. (Hailey) Lindsay is the 2026 Recovery Day Breakfast

During this time, they have had legal custody of her kids for about two years, since their dad had died. Along for other reasons I will not get into, we kept chatting not getting concerned quite yet. But around a half hour to an hour later my now Sister-In-Law's mom got a phone call. She went into a separate room and when she came out, she was in tears and said that she had just been informed that their Neice Lena had just died. She was killed by a drunk driver going 100 mph, ran a red light and hit Lena's car as it traveled through the intersection on a green light. This experience has inspired me to be even more involved in my mission to help prevent substance abuse. One of my future goals are to become more involved in Law Enforcement such as becoming a police officer. Another one of my goals if I achieve this role is to help prevent people from going through something similar to what I went through. I have had a lot of experience in leadership roles through my church, and other organizations, as well as a lot of experience working with adults.
